Attention: Due to ongoing repairs of the streetcar tracks, the trams that run along Währinger Straße (37, 38, 40, 41, 42) are replaced by buses between the Schottentor and Volksoper subway stations. These buses follow slightly different routes than the trams they replace. Wiener Linien (Vienna's public transportation company) recommends to go by foot along Währinger Straße, if possible, as the buses may not be able to handle the demand for transportation in this area, especially at rush hour.
